

About the Centre

Woy Woy Peninsula Community Child Care Centre opened in 1977 and is a not-for-profit, community based organisation that depends on fees, fundraising, State & Federal subsidies to maintain its operation.

We are managed by a Board of Directors that is made up of past and present users of the service and community members, as well as being monitored by the NSW Department of Communities and Families, Community Services at state and the Australian Government Department of Families, Housing, Community Services and Indigenous Affairs at federal level.

Our Centre is unique in that we offer two separately funded childcare placement options:

State Funded Preschool – 8:45am to 3.15pm State & Commonwealth Funded Long Day Care – 7.30am to 5.30pm

National Quality Framework

The Centre is currently rated as <u>Meeting</u> (April 2021) the National Quality Standard (NQS) which is divided into Seven Quality Areas. Each Quality Area contains a number of standards, which are high level outcome statements.

We were rated <u>Exceeding</u> in Quality Area 2 Children's Health and Safety and Quality Area 5 Relationships with Children. The NQS contains 23 standards with between two and six standards for each Quality area. Each area is broken into elements or indicators.

The centre is assessed by a representative of NSW Early Childhood Education and Care Directorate, Department of Education and given a rating which is displayed in the foyer.

To prepare for this process the Staff, Families and Management Committee examine and evaluate every aspect of the Centre's operation and its effectiveness.

The Centre has developed a Quality Improvement Plan which outlines how the service is continually working towards improvement.
